## **APOSTLE**

You are built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Jesus Christ as your cornerstone. Therefore, you must walk this special path which the apostles and particularly Christ walked. Take care this apostolic spirit never weakens.

"Come follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people."

What was Jordan's concept of an apostle? One called by Christ who obediently went anywhere and willingly suffered anything to take the light of the gospel to those living in the shadow of darkness, even to the point of shedding one's blood. Likewise, the men and women called to Jordan's side were to live and work like apostles. Obedient to the will of the Founder, they were to go willingly, and to suffer anything for the sake of the gospel. Theirs was to be "apostolic zeal" in the most original sense of the word – the zeal of an apostle.
